SIMON ABUBAKAR

11 March 1961 - 29 September 2006

Simon Abubakar, as the West Region Member of Brisbane Junior Rugby Union Inc (BJRU) then Management Committee was a major contributor in the genesis of the BJRU Under 12 Skills Development Program which began in 2005. In that same year, he was also a selector for the Central Region teams and Assistant Coach of the Under 12 West Navy Team.

Simon's passion for all things rugby started in 1999 after deciding that his son Eli should become involved with a team sport, and rugby union was to be it. A spectator at his son's first season in 2000, he decided to become involved. He was elected Vice-President of Kenmore Centenary Rugby Union Club; and he also took up the role of Assistant Coach of the Under 7 Reds. His beloved son played in this team and he continued to coach it for the next six years.

Rugby became Simon's passion; but coaching rugby was his real passion. From his first tentative steps in 2000, Simon set about learning all he could about coaching, becoming a Level 2 coach in 2005. In addition to his involvement in several U12 Development teams, he was coach of several Brisbane teams for the Queensland Junior Rugby Union State Championship. Not content with this, he was also Assistant Coach for two seasons with The University of Queensland Rugby Club's senior teams.

In 2001, Simon was elected President of Kenmore JRU. During his time as President, he was instrumental in the growth of the club, almost doubling its numbers. He oversaw the agreement between Kenmore and Queensland University to set up a pathway for the clubs' older players. When Kenmore's numbers grew to 500, Simon realized there was room for another club in the western suburbs and went about investigating (along with long standing committee member Nick Black) possible areas where a satellite club of Kenmore could be established. Forest Lake was identified as a growth area which in years to come would be able to support its own club. In 2004 "The Lakes Rugby Club" was born.



After three years Simon stepped down as President of Kenmore and in November 2004 was elected to the then BJRU Management Committee. As the West Region Representative, none could doubt his capabilities in representing that Region.

Simon launched himself into managing the BJRU becoming involved with the State Championships as a selector and coach. He was integral to the proper running of the judiciary; and he contributed to the foundation raising of the Under 12 Skills Development Program. He willingly used his skills as a solicitor to provide legal advice to the BJRU on such things as Competition Rules and judiciary matters. He was a major contributor in compiling the BJRU Strategic Plan in 2006.

Whilst still the BJRU West Region Representative in September 2006, at the age of 45 years, after a short battle with cancer Simon sadly passed away. He is missed by not only his wife Marie and son Eli, but also the members of the Brisbane Rugby community.

Simon was an honourable, gentle man, with a great sense of humour, always smiling, and a man who made an impression on all who met him. His contribution to Junior Rugby can best be summed up by an excerpt from a letter written to him by one of his “boys” from the Kenmore Under 13 Reds:

“Thank you for being such a committed coach to our team. Thank you for teaching us well. I’m not only thanking you for teaching our team, I am thanking you for teaching me to play rugby. When I first started rugby with you I was a chattering annoying boy who hardly knew how to play rugby at all but after you taught me and sorted me out I was a chattering, annoying rugby player who could play real rugby”.

“We will remember him”



It is with this sentiment and in honour of Simon’s contribution to junior rugby that the Brisbane Junior Rugby Union has officially renamed the carnival as the U12 Simon Abubakar Carnival, with the winning team at the end of the carnival to be presented with the U12 Simon Abubakar Memorial Shield.

Welcome to the seventeenth Under 12 Carnival. The Carnival was created by the BJRU in 2005 and in 2007 renamed in honour of the late Simon Abubakar from the Kenmore Centenary Junior Rugby Union Club. Simon epitomized the philosophy of junior rugby in Brisbane, having made significant contributions to his club, and to the Board of the BJRU. He was a man with an extreme passion for the game of rugby. It is more than fitting to have a junior carnival in his name.

The spirit of this Carnival is to introduce our Under 12 players to the next stage of their involvement in rugby. We congratulate all players who made themselves available for selection and who will participate in the Carnival. We know they will all benefit from this experience.

Our thanks to the Selectors, Coaches and Managers for giving their time so generously. The added responsibility of representative teams takes many hours of their time, and in most cases, this is additional to their Club commitments.

Please remember, as a development program, it is also about providing a future opportunity to develop our coaches, managers and as well, our junior referees. During this year's Carnival, two teams will be selected to represent the BJRU at the Under 12 Development Carnival held during the Qld Rugby State Championships, being held this year at Downlands College, Toowoomba on 2 – 4 July 2021. The two BJRU teams will be selected from all players participating in this carnival and will be prepared to compete against teams from other regions throughout Queensland and the Northern Territory.

We look forward to welcoming everyone to the Carnival and we wish you all an enjoyable and rewarding weekend of Rugby.

As per our carnival directive, this carnival provides not only an opportunity for player development, but also our coaches, managers, and our match officials. Many of our match officials range in age between 14 and 18 years. They are all Level 1 qualified and are regularly refereeing every weekend.



The referees during this carnival will be under the guidance of several referee coaches, who will work with them and help to continue their development. There is a distinct pathway for referees within Australia. The BJRU clubs are encouraged to get their young players involved in refereeing from the age of 11 years in U6 – U9 rugby matches, from 14 years in U10 – U12 and onto Level 1 from 15 years of age. From here the referees could develop through local, state and national championships to improve their skills and move onto the top echelons of international rugby.

Carnival Competition Rules & Judiciary

Competition Rules

The Carnival is to be conducted using the 2021 Brisbane Junior Rugby Union Inc Competition Rules. Any variations to those rules are covered in the following paragraphs.

Laws of the Game

All matches will be played as per the Laws of the game for RAU U19 Rugby and U12 Pathway Law variations notified by the BJRU for 2021. The ONLY exception to the variations is the playing time which has been reduced to 20 mins each half and 5 mins half time.

Player Equity

Each player is to be given an equitable opportunity to participate in the carnival and gain as much experience as possible. Realistically, some players will have more playing time than others due to injury and specialist positions as well as other circumstances that may arise. Every player is to start in the run on side for at least one game.

Draw

As per the issued draw and can only be modified by the Carnival Convenor or the Carnival Co-ordinator in consultation with the BJRU Board.

Duration of Play & Time Off

There is no Time Off allowed unless the Carnival Co-ordinator allows it in special circumstances such as a serious injury stopping a game and only then if it is practical.

There will be no extra time in any of the pool matches and each game will be 20-minute halves with a 5-minute break for half time.

In the final match of the carnival (2.30pm game) if the points scored by the teams are equal at full time, an extra five (5) minutes each way shall be played to determine the winner.

One minute shall be allowed to change ends at full time and after the first period of extra time. The method of restart for each period will be a kick off at halfway, decided by a toss of the coin and then alternated for the second period.

If points scored by teams are equal after playing extra time, no further extra time shall be played and both teams declared JOINT WINNERS.

Match Results

Managers are to submit their results via the Rugby Link App and must hand in the Original Team Sheet to the Carnival Co-ordinator within 10 minutes of the match being completed.

Results and Pool Tables will be posted within 30 minutes of the completion of each match.

Complaints

All complaints must be submitted to the Carnival Co-ordinator in writing within 20 minutes of the completion of the match.

The Carnival Co-ordinator and 2 Members of the BJRU Board, or their representatives, will meet to decide all complaints.

Judiciary


The Judiciary Committee shall consist of a BJRU Life Member, or his representative and two other persons approved by the Board.

Players sent off during a match will be required to appear before the Judiciary Committee within 30 minutes of the completion of the match.

Players are suspended from playing until they appear before the Judiciary.

When crouched, the distance between opposing front rows should be close enough that players' heads are interlinked approximately ear to ear. There must be a clear non-verbal pause between 'bind' and 'set'. ◆ A team must not push the scrum more than 1 metre (FK).


